New National Cookie Selling Initiative.

National is trying a new cookie selling initiative:

- Girls selling 5, 10 or 25 cases will receive rewards.
- Girls and their families will be responsible to manage their own orders.
- Each girl will preorder the number of cases she will sell and then tell her Guider how many cases she wants.
- The Guider will place the order.
- When the order arrives the girl and her family will be responsible for selling her allotted cookies.
- Districts will increase the numbers of their orders as they feel their district will need.

There will be a National "Girl Cookie Rewards" program:

Chocolatey Mint Cookie Recipe

MAGIC MINT BARS

(supplied by Janet Lynch, Provincial Product Marketing Adviser for New Brunswick)

Ingredients:

2 cups of graham wafer crumbs
3/4 cup of melted butter
1 can Eagle Brand sweetened condensed milk
1 cup of chocolatey mint cookies, chopped
1/2 cup of chocolate chips
1 -1/3 cups chopped pecans or almonds
1-1/3 cups flaked coconut



Method

Combine graham crumbs with butter.
Press evenly onto parchment paper-lined 13X9 inch baking pan.
Pour Eagle Brand evenly over crumbs.
Mix remaining ingredients and sprinkle over Eagle Brand.
Press down firmly.
Bake in preheated 325 degrees F oven for 25-30 minutes or until lightly browned.
Cool thoroughly and cut into bars.
Store at room temperature.

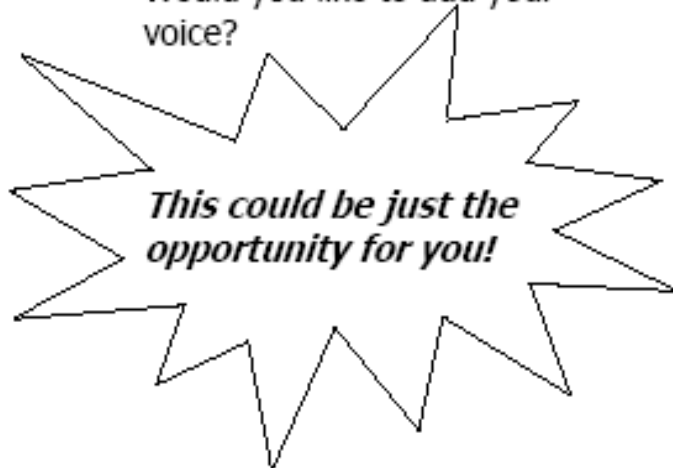

In the book "**Girl Guiding/ Girl Scouting: A Challenging Movement**", which is produced by World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS), the Good Turn is listed as a symbol of unity. It states:

The Good Turn

symbolizes the service given by all members of the movement to the community. Younger girls think of ways they can do a Good Turn every day, whilst older girls develop this further into service projects at local, national and international levels (page 28).



Saskatoon Area promotes the idea of service at all levels of Guiding. It can be as simple as cleaning up the litter in the school yard or as involved as learning to knit blankets for a homeless shelter.

CAMPING/TREFOIL TRAILS TASK FORCE REPORT

All Saskatoon adult Guiding members, as well as Pathfinders, Senior Branches and 3rd year Guides, were invited to participate in a survey to see what the interest was in camping in Saskatoon Area, with a focus on the Trefoil Trails campsite at Pike Lake. Of 200 letters sent out, we had 80 replies. All that replied were aware of the camp and most had been there at some point. Of these, 61 percent were unit Guiders, and 80 percent of those unit Guiders had camped at Trefoil Trails in the last 3 years.

The survey leads us to the following immediate areas of focus:

1. MAINTENANCE

- with the main emphasis being Nyeri [the Guide site]
- general grounds and equipment maintenance

2. EDUCATION

- produce a manual for Trefoil Trails, detailing what is available on site
- skill sessions and Area programmed camps to help familiarize Guiders with camping and Trefoil Trails

3. PROMOTION

- promote Trefoil Trails as the camp of choice both within and outside Guiding



People had great suggestions, particularly if money were no object, and some things were repeated often - flush toilets, running water all year round, shower facilities, updating the lodge, more sleeping cabins, onsite interpretive program, playground or challenging area a few of these.

Many are willing to assist but not in the way the traditional "Camp Committee" has operated. With that in mind, a group of interested Guiders met on October 8 at Guide House. A new "Camping Team" has been structured with a different focus, pulling resources from a wider range of people and offering more specific tasks and a lighter workload.
